Rangayan: The Dramatics Society

In the early months of 2024, Rangayan held workshops and orientation sessions for freshers to introduce them to theatre (Stage & Street) and the theatre society of the college. The college hosted its orientation day on 30th August 2024 and conducted workshops for juniors on 2nd and 4th September 2024. Throughout the year, Rangayan performed its annual stage production “Netuva” and street production “UN-एकता” in various theatre festivals and competitions, winning many awards.

Key events include participating in IIT Bombay, SPM College, Kalindi College, Ashoka University, NSUT, Miranda House, Abhivyakti, Create Theatre Festival, National School of Drama under Bharat Rang Mahotsav, Noida Rang Mahotsav, Samarpan, Dastaan, Manch Utsava, Umang, Drishyantar, Befikr, and Meraki Theatre Festival. Apart from society recognition, individual awards were also won by Lakshya Anand, Paras Chauhan, Rahul, Astha Upadhyay, Natya, Yavanika, and Drishyantar.

Rang Umang, an intra-college skit competition, was organized by Rangayan on 13th November 2024. In January 2025, Rangsheersh Jaidev Theatre Festival (RJTF) was organized, providing students with the opportunity to learn and perform at the Shri Ram Centre of Performing Arts. Along with the members and alumni of Rangayan, students from various societies such as Saarang (Music Society), and Kalashree (Folk Dance Society) also participated in the event. Three different plays were performed on 28th, 29th, and 30th January 2025, including Skandgupt (Written by Jai Shankar Prasad, Directed by Ravi Taneja), Chimte Wale Baba (Written by Lalit Mohan Thapliyal, Directed by Himmat Singh Negi, and Uchhako ka Chorus (Written by Avinash Chandra Mishra, Directed by Vasishta Upadhyay) on 28th, 29th and 30th January, 2025. The members of the Dramatics Society represented the college in several national-level competitions. During the academic year, the participants won approximately 20 prizes in stage plays and 21 prizes in street plays. Inter-College Competition for Street as well Stage was also organized under RJTF’25 at the college campus and Muktdhara Auditorium respectively. The competition involved many theatre societies from different colleges.
