NIMBUS: The English Debating Society

Nimbus, the English Debating Society of Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College, has demonstrated a dynamic and productive academic year, marked by a series of well-organized events ranging from orientation workshops to high-level competitive tournaments. The society's activities showcase its commitment to fostering critical thinking, public speaking, and intellectual discourse.

The year commenced with an Orientation and Exhibition Debate on 28th August 2025, attracting approximately 80 attendees. The session introduced the society's structure, training councils, and debate formats, including Parliamentary and Conventional styles. The highlight was an exhibition 1-vs-1 debate, which served as a practical demonstration of debating skills.

A key focus of Nimbus is skill development. On 20th September 2025, in collaboration with the Placement Cell, the society hosted a Group Discussion (GD) Session for 100 participants. The event featured distinguished speakers: Anubhava Singla (World Bank, Indian Parliament), Vibhor Vanvani (Financial Research Associate, The D.E. Shaw Group), and Argha K. Dubey (Ex-Consulting, EY India). They provided expert guidance on GD strategies, followed by practice sessions with personalized feedback.

The society also organized two notable conventional debate competitions. The Equinox Conventional Debate Competition on 22nd September 2025 saw 40 participants debate the motion "The House Supports the Developing Country's Claim to the Right to Burn," focusing on environmental sustainability versus developmental rights. The event was adjudicated by Suhani Gandhi and Krish Anand. Later, on 23rd January 2026, the Republic Day Conventional Debate Competition engaged 29 participants. Winners included the team of Rohan Bhagat and Janhavi Singh (Best Team), with Priyanshi Malik and Priya Sharma named Best Speakers for and against the motion, respectively.

Nimbus's flagship event, Ehsaas '26, was a three-day Asian Parliamentary Debate Tournament held from 21st to 23rd March 2026, with approximately 55 participants. Over three days, contestants engaged in rigorous rounds on themes such as health, culture, minorities, and international relations. The event concluded with a grand finale where the Open category champions, Spice Girls of Arrakis, and Novice category winners, X, were felicitated by the Principal, Professor Gyantosh Kumar Jha. Ayush Bermola and Bhavay Wahi were adjudged Best Adjudicators.

Finally, Nimbus hosted the Youth Conclave 2026 on 9th and 10th March, a Model United Nations conference centered on the All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM). The 15 delegates debated the agenda of "Reviewing the Use and Misuse of Central Investigative Agencies in Indian Federal Politics," with Parth Loya being named Best Delegate.

Through these diverse initiatives—from workshops with prominent speakers to internal competitions and large-scale national tournaments—Nimbus has consistently provided a platform for students to engage in meaningful dialogue and develop essential professional skills.
