National Cadet Corps (NCC)

During the academic session 2025–26, the ARSD NCC Unit 7 DBN organized a wide spectrum of events, camps, and activities under the able supervision and guidance of Principal Prof. Gyantosh Kumar Jha, Vice-Principal and IQAC Coordinator Prof. Vinita Tuli, and ANO SD Prof. (Capt.) Sandeep. The unit remained actively engaged throughout the year in fostering the core values of the National Cadet Corps, including discipline, leadership, unity, and selfless service. These activities were carefully designed to ensure the holistic development of cadets by combining physical training, intellectual engagement, social outreach, and cultural participation. On 9 April, 2025, ARSD NCC organized a speaker session titled “Motivating Youth Towards the Armed Forces,” delivered by Air Marshal Sanjeev Kapoor. The session was highly impactful, as the speaker shared real-life experiences from his distinguished career in the Indian Air Force, highlighting the importance of leadership in critical situations, decision-making under pressure, and the spirit of sacrifice. His powerful words encouraged cadets to look beyond personal ambitions and consider serving the nation with dedication and honor. The interaction left the audience deeply motivated and instilled a renewed sense of patriotism and purpose.

On 14 May, 2025, a Tiranga Yatra was conducted by ARSD NCC to demonstrate solidarity with the Indian Army during a time of heightened border tensions.
